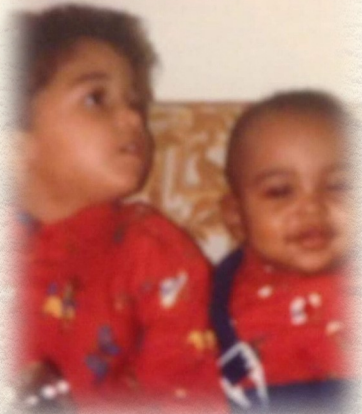


# The Footprint Prayer
